Exemplar Awards 2010: Event overview

The 'Everything Happens Somewhere' 2010 conference puts the spotlight on the importance of location and place to service delivery within local government, the fire and rescue service and police forces. The one day event combines presentations from key industry experts with networking opportunities, a well supported exhibition and also includes the presentation of the 2010 Exemplar Awards. The event aims to foster innovation and improvement whilst also showcasing and rewarding best practice.

The National Land and Property Gazetteer (NLPG) and National Street Gazetteer (NSG), created at source by local government, has resulted in the first, definitive, national lists of addresses and streets. The data provides unique identification of streets and properties across England and Wales and is maintained virtually in real-time by 100% of local authorities.

The Gazetteers are used by local government and their partners in the fire and rescue services, police forces and national parks, to link their information and systems to transform and improve services whilst generating real operational savings. The Gazetteers underpin many innovative applications in local government and are used to build GI services, underpin CRM, Electoral Roll, local taxation, planning, education, highways, housing and the myriad of other local government services.

Themes within the conference include:

- the importance of location to service delivery
- using location information to generate business savings
- achieving efficiency savings through joined up data
- using intelligence to improve environmental outcomes and provide better services for citizens
- an insight into technology and services that enhances interaction between the public sector and its customers
- approaches to and the importance of sharing data across different agencies and partnership working
- controlling and coordinating street works
- cutting traffic disruption and reducing inconvenience to the public
- case studies from Exemplar authorities

The Everything Happens Somewhere conference is moving to the opulent Cutlers' Hall venue in Sheffield for 2010. The conference and exhibition offers extensive networking opportunities within a flexible environment alongside key decision-makers and practitioners from local authorities, fire and rescue services, police forces and national park authorities.

Target audience

The conference will explore the role of the NLPG and NSG in enabling partnership working between local authorities and the fire and rescue services, police forces and other users of standardised address information. We would particularly like to welcome delegates from those sectors.
